He has been active in teaching at all levels, having received awards for contributions to the Residency training program, as well as serving as Chairman of the Examination Board in Pediatric Cardiology for the Royal College. Dr. Human was born and raised in Southern Africa, and then attended Oxford University in England on a Beit Scholarship, where he obtained an Honours Degree in Physiology and completed his Medical Degree. Following further training in England and South Africa, in 1981 Dr. Human accepted an appointment as a Consultant Pediatric Cardiologist at the Red Cross War Memorial Children's Hospital, in the Department of Pediatrics at the University of Cape Town. In 1987 he moved to Canada to take an appointment as Consultant Pediatric Cardiologist at the Red of the Division of Cardiology at BC Children's Hospital and at the University of British Columbia. He was appointed Medical Director of the Cardiac Sciences program at BC Children's Hospital in 2001 to 2010, and was appointed to Clinical Professor in 2005.

Cavalcante earned his medical degree from the Federal University of Ceará, Brazil. His training includes residency and chief resident in internal medicine and cardiovascular fellowship at Henry Ford Hospital in Detroit, Michigan. He pursued an advanced cardiovascular imaging training at the Cleveland Clinic where he was appointed chief fellow. There he obtained the highest levels of certification and training (COCATS Level III) in the areas of Interventional and Intraoperative Echocardiography, Cardiovascular CT and Cardiae Magnetic Resonance. Dr Cavalcante joined the senior faculty of the University of Pittsburgh Heart & Vascular Institute in September 2012 as Assistant Professor of Medicine. Since then he has been actively involved in the heart team evaluation and echocardiographic guidance of minimally invasive percutaneous procedures. In June/2013, he received by unanimous vote the Edward I. Curtiss Outstanding Teacher Award from the cardiology fellows.
